

Most households pay less than £99 in district council tax, but **receive** services worth £776 from us.





Where your money goes

As your district council we collect all the Council Tax and business rates in Breckland, but most of what we collect is on behalf of Norfolk County Council, Norfolk Police, and town and parish councils. You can see below how each pound of Council Tax you pay is shared out.

The rate of district council tax in Breckland continues to be among the very lowest in the country. You can see how Breckland's yearly rate compared to other Norfolk councils in 2020/21 in the chart below.

All councils use Band D for comparison purposes, but what you actually pay depends on whether your district council includes a parish tax (a precept), whether your parish also sets a precept, and which band your house is in. Around 75% of Breckland residents live in houses in Band A-C, so will pay less than the Band D rate. The enclosed bill shows what you will pay for the year 2021/22.
